

## Tips

- Use only fresh, high quality feed
- Remove stale feeds from the bunk
- Feed regularly-preferable two or three times a day if hand feeding
- Observe regularly for disorders
- Provide clean, fresh water at all times.
- Water is the most important nutrient.
- A calf weighing 500 lbs will drink 5-12 gallons of water.
- A 750 lb calf will drink 7-18 gallons of water.
- It takes about 2500 pounds of grain and 2000 pounds of hay to properly feed a market calf over the last 170 days.
- Before starting a beef project you should consider that it may have a sizeable investment in excess of \$2000.00. You should develop a cash flow budget and be sure that you have adequate funding for this project.
